You may have noticed that the help and the solidarity I have talked about till now comes from states and governments. Yet, all of us can contribute in our own way. In order to be able to support the victims of the earthquake, we here at Kapri+ have organized a charity run and donated the money to those who need it.

# **Students Save Lives**

People from the University of Medicine in Mainz visited our school. The reason for this visit was to teach us what to do in emergency situation, especially what to do to save someon's life in emergency situations such as accidents.

For this, we met them in the lab where they had a doll lying on the floor to pracice using it. We learned how to do mouth ventilation and heart massage. My class was divided into four groups with a doll for each group. In case of accidents, we learned that first we had to check if the person is still breathing by hearing his breath with our ears .

If the person is not breathing, remove the clothes from the upper body and start a heart massage for 30 times, then perform two mouth ventilations while holding the nose. And then continue to perform 30 heart massages again. It is important to look for the electric shock machine but, of course, but in all cases you should call the emergency services. You should do these steps untill the emergency services arrive, hoping that the injured person regains consciousness.

This workshop was very benefecial, I have learned how to help an injured person in my surroundings in such situations. I also have learned that a lot of lives could be saved by using this method.




















## **Behind the Stage**







## **Ingredients**

270 grams soft butter

170 grams sugar

5 medium sized eggs

180 grams wheat flour

150 grams ground hazelnuts

2 teaspoons of baking powder

a pinch of salt

50 grams baking cocoa



## Step 1

Preheat the oven to 180 degrees (top and bottom heat).

Grease and flour a large loaf pan (28 cm).

Alternatively, you can also use a springform pan, but the baking time must be adjusted accordingly.

## Step 2

For the dough, beat the soft butter with the sugar until fluffy, then mix in the eggs one at a time. Slowly add the flour mixed with the almonds, baking powder, salt and baking cocoa; Finally

#### Step 3

Pour the batter into the prepared form and smooth out.

Bake for about 50-60 minutes.

Do a chopstick test.

The cake can (and should) still be moist on the inside.

Leave the cake to cool in the pan.

Cover the cake with chocolate icing.
